HOME ENERGY PROGRAM PREPARES FOR NEW HEATING SEASON-SEEKS COMMENTS ON STATE PLAN

BALTIMORE – The Maryland Department of Human Resources is serving people through its Maryland Energy Assistance Program (MEAP). The Maryland Energy Assistance Program provides assistance with home heating bills.

The program will start accepting applications for program year 2016 on July 1, 2015 and will end May 31, 2016. MEAP plans to serve approximately 177,750 households with an average grant of \$520.

To prepare for the 2016 program year, the Department will be conducting two public hearings to garner ic comment on its proposed state operational plan and its integrity plan. The state plan outlines strategies to provide services to assist citizens to meet their increasing energy cost. The integrity plan outline policies and procedures to identify and address fraud. The proposed annual State Plans are available for review on www.dhr.maryland.gov/ohep. Recommendations will be considered in developing the final program plan.

There will be two public hearings, the first one in Dorchester County on June 9, 2015 at Dorchester County DSS and the second one in Howard County on June 11, 2015 at Howard County Gateway Building. All are encouraged to participate in the public hearing process.

The Maryland Department of Human Resources (DHR), the state's human service provider.
